New electronic Official Personnel Folder (eOPF) Login Instruction Sheet


eOPF is the electronic version of your Official Personnel Folder and contains all official records required to document your Federal career.

Using a government-provided system with secure internet connections, launch your web browser using Internet Explorer 6.0 or higher.

*MAC users should use Safari to access the following web address <https://hcie.nasa.gov>. MAC users should also follow the special instructions on the HCIE Work Force Services Portal log on screen. Click on "Learn More" under the eOPF icon.

Instructions for accessing eOPF from the Portal page.



1. Locate and click on the white eOPF Icon located on lower right of the front page.
2. Type your eOPF User ID in the eOPF ID block (**If you have forgotten your eOPF log in ID or password**, please contact the NSSC eOPF team through the NSSC Center at 877-677-2123.
3. Type in your password and click submit.

Once you are in, you can view your files by clicking on the Orange circle with the A.
